

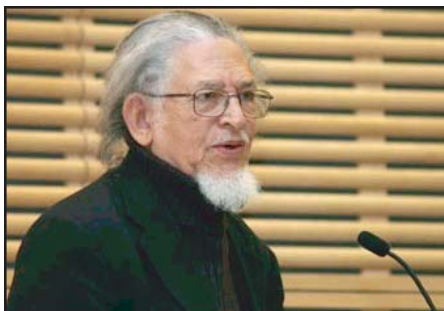

He was sent into exile in 1966 and after a long legal struggle, came to the US as a political refugee.
